## Spring is the Time to Break the Ice Among Our Neighbours

As we look forward to warmer weather, let's think of the many opportunities available to meet our neighbours and have fun!

Spring is just around the corner and with it come great opportunities to bring your neighbours together. Special days such as April Fools' Day, Earth Week, Mother's Day or Victoria Day can inspire you to organize an activity. Neighbourhood cleanups, Easter egg hunts, plant swaps, pancake breakfasts, cob oven cook-offs, garage sales and Jane's Walks are activities that can bring neighbours together in the spring.

Break the ice so you and your neighbours can connect with each other and grow a stronger sense of belonging. Enlist the help of neighbours, not just to lighten your load, but also to include your neighbours as you organize the event. Invite everyone in your neighbourhood, and reduce barriers to participation to make your neighbourhood gathering as inclusive as possible. Think of ways to make sure that there is something for everyone. For example, combine a pancake breakfast with an Easter Egg Hunt to engage children and adults for a fun time. Check out the Reach! Challenge for tips on how to make your neighbourhood gathering more inclusive.

Festival of Neighbourhoods encourages people to come together with their neighbours. You might feel your neighbourhood is just your street, or several surrounding streets, or even the apartment building where you live. Just be sure to include everyone.
